Student Responsibilities

- Show up to class on time.
- Sit in your assigned seat (unless activities require otherwise).
- No cell phone / earbuds during class (unless specifically told otherwise). I will be cracking down on phone usage. If you continue to use your phone after being told not to, you will be required to put the phone in "jail".
- Be prepared to engage in conversations/activities, but be respectful of the classroom rules. There should be no outside conversations during direct instruction.
- Laptops will be used each day (bring your charger!!).
- No bathroom breaks during the first & last 10 minutes of class or during direct instruction. I will also be keeping track of and cracking down on excessive breaks.
- Only one student is allowed to leave the class at a time. Be respectful of the time you take (others may be waiting for you to get back).
- If you are having any issues that effect your ability to attend class/focus/participate, PLEASE keep me informed. I'm here to help!
- If you are absent for any reason, it is your responsibility to make up any missed work/activities.

Late work

Late work : First of all, LATE WORK is not MAKE UP WORK. Make up work is when you were absent/out of class and need to make up the work. Simply complete that in a timely manner. LATE WORK is assignments I've given adequate time for you to complete, you were in class, but you failed to complete on time. For those assignments, the policy is below.

Treat late work like calling out from work. You do that AHEAD of time. If you realize you're not going to finish an assignment by the due date, simple e-mail me. Tell me why it will be late and when you anticipate turning it in. ALWAYS CHECK FOR MY REPLY!!

Otherwise, there will be a 10 point per day reduction for lateness. Additionally, I will only accept assignments up to 1 week after the due date. Anything later then that will not be accepted. I don't give much homework, and I try to provide adequate class time for completion, so I hope there won't be much late work!

I'm aware there may be extenuating circumstances from time to time. Please communicate with me as fully as you can. I am willing to work with you when emergencies arise!

Assessments and Assignments

Students will complete assessments during each unit of study to assess their understanding. Students will complete the CUSD Common Final at the end of the first and second semesters. The Common Final will count for 20% of the student's final semester grade in grades 9-12 and 10% in grades 7-8 (some exceptions may apply at the Junior High level). Common finals will be in ELA, Math, Science, Social Science, and World Language.

Final exams will be given during the CUSD Jr High/High School Early Dismissal days in December and May, as identified on the [District Calendar](#).

If students are requested to participate in a survey, the survey questions will be provided to parents/guardians seven days before student contact.

Quarter grades

Semester grades are calculated using 40/40/20: Each quarter accounts for 40% of the semester grade and the final exam accounts for the remaining 20%.
