Vote here and vote often! Let's get Chandler High Football recognized as the great program it is! Vote now!





CHANDLER PUBLIC LIBRARY DATABASE-A GREAT RESOURCE- FACTS ON FILE

History reports - current events - what happened on your birthday? *Facts on File* can help you find it all! Search by topic, search by date, or browse headlines. *Facts on File* is divided into three databases: Issues & Controversies includes hot topics like Gun Control. Today's Science covers subjects like Genetics. World News Digest features recent stories, as well as top news items from around the world and historical news listings back to the 1940s.

To access *Facts on File* from home, start at <u>chandlerlibrary.org</u> and hover your mouse over the purple RESEARCH tab. Then click Databases A-Z, and scroll down to choose *Facts on File* Databases. You'll need your library card and PIN if you're signing in from home. Then you can choose from Issues & Controversies, Today's Science, or World News Digest.

Seniors, are you applying to colleges that use the Common Application? There are 549 institutions, including the most selective ones, which utilize the Common App. For your counselor and teachers to complete the online recommendation on your behalf, you must first invite them on your Common Application. Only when your counselor and teachers receive the invitation through the Common App, can they access the system to complete the recommendation. If you have any questions regarding the Common App process, please see your counselor.

TAX CREDIT

Arizona law ARS 43-1089.01 enables taxpayers a tax credit contribution of up to \$400.00 per calendar year if filing status is Married, filing Joint Return; \$200.00 per calendar year if filing status is Single or Head of Household; and, \$200.00 per calendar year if filing status is Married filing separate return — for contributions that fund extracurricular activities in public schools.

Contributions eligible for a tax credit are donated directly to schools, not to the state or the school district. To participate you can print a form to complete and submit your contribution.
