

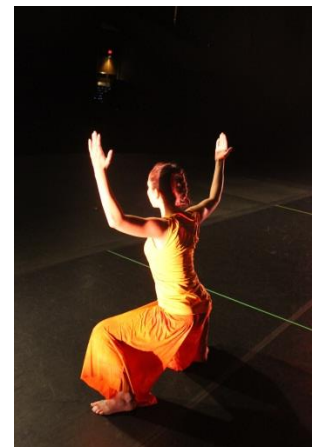


## WINNING WOLVES

CHS will administer the ACT non-writing test to juniors at Chandler High on Wednesday, April 23<sup>rd</sup>. Students should log on to [www.act.org](http://www.act.org) to view practice tests, the approved calculator list, and helpful testing tips. Juniors were given additional information and completed the Pre-Administration portion of the test last week in their English classes. Students are allowed to choose up to four colleges or universities to send their scores to, but they may opt to leave this section blank. Students are encouraged to bring an approved calculator; the school will not provide calculators.

Students are required to have a current picture ID.
