

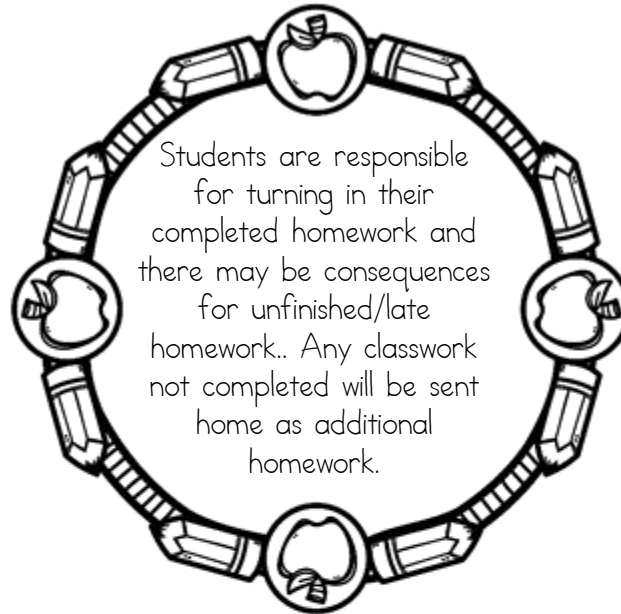

It is our goal to make your child's experience positive. We will ensure your child has every opportunity to learn essential skills necessary for his or her growth and development.

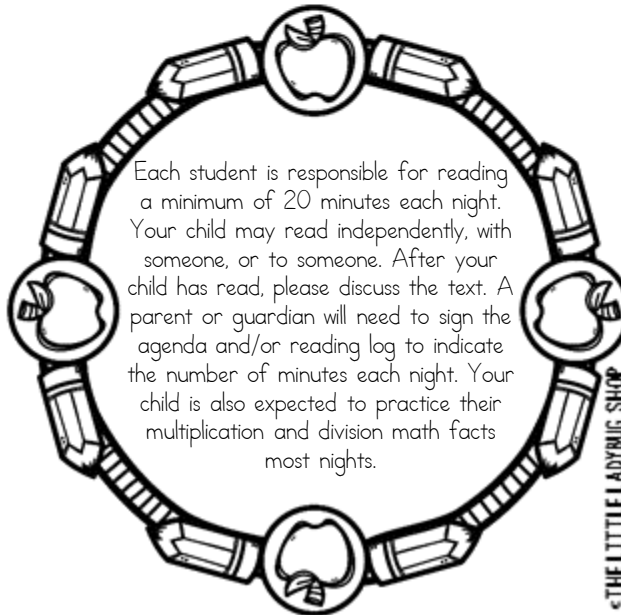

Weekly newsletters and our web page will include class information and upcoming school events. Please feel free to contact us if you have any questions or concerns. We are looking forward to working with you and your child.

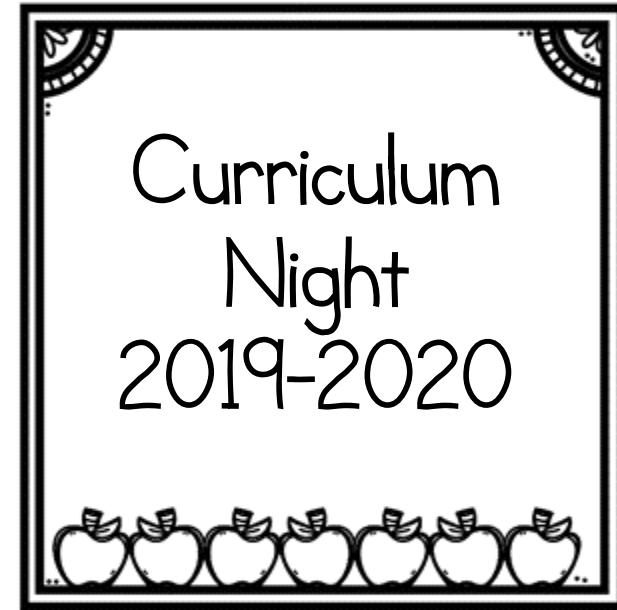


Students are responsible for turning in their completed homework and there may be consequences for unfinished/late homework.. Any classwork not completed will be sent home as additional homework.

Nightly Reading, Math Facts and Agendas



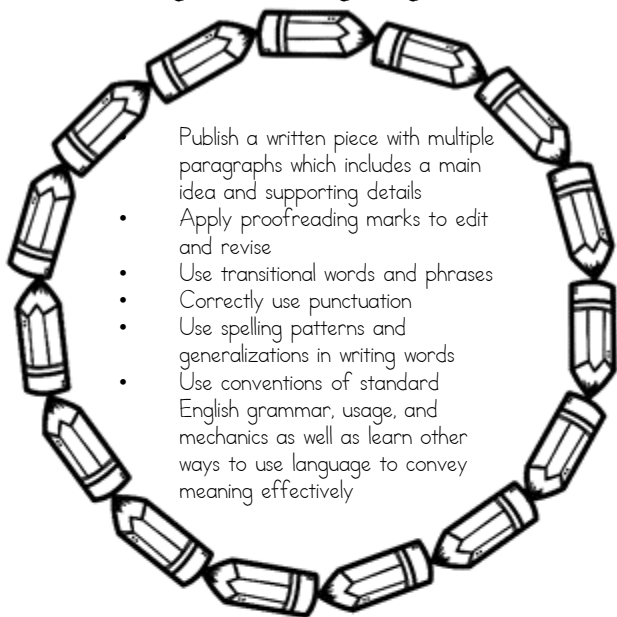

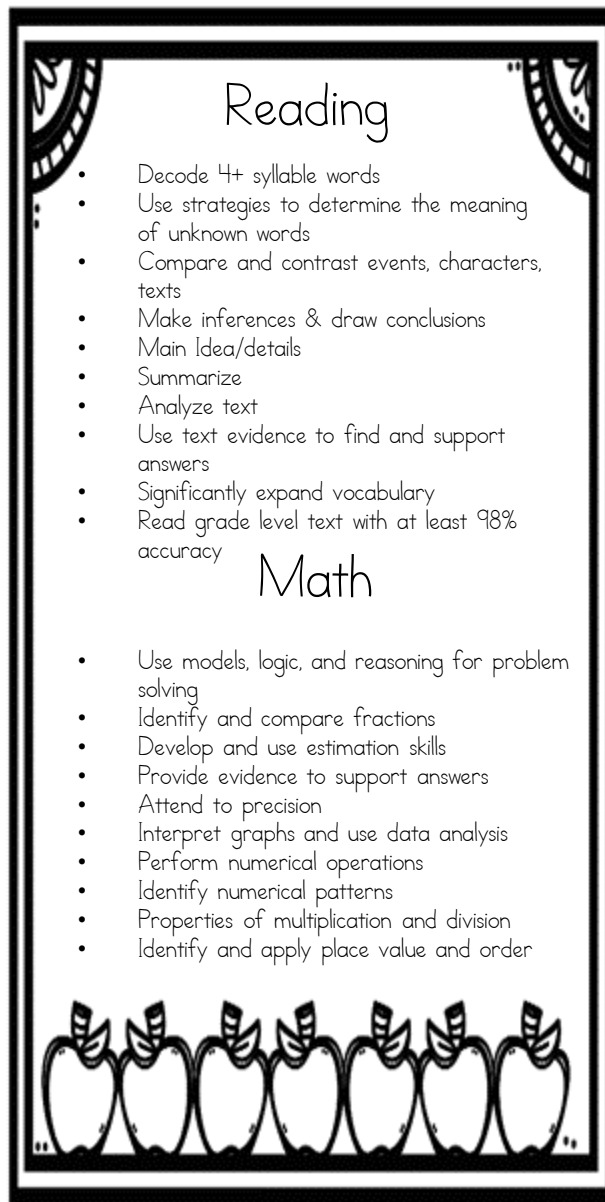

Reading

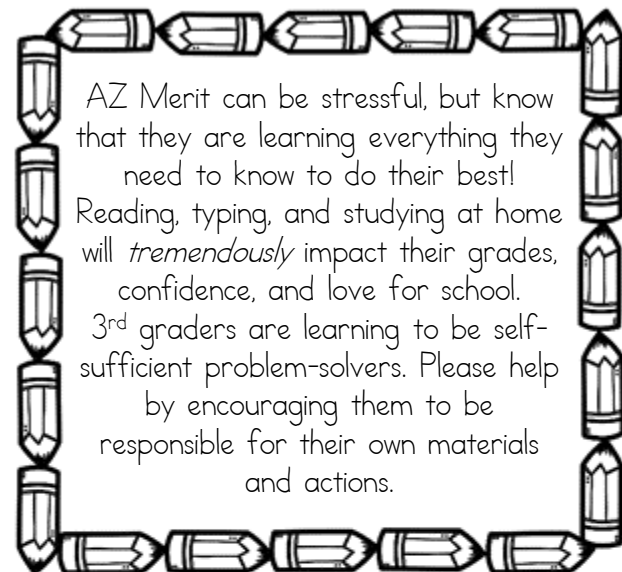
- Decode 4+ syllable words

Tips for Parents

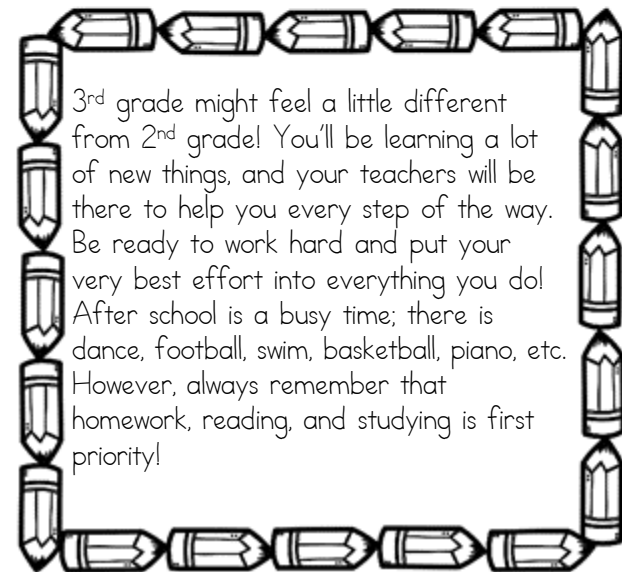


AZ Merit can be stressful, but know that they are learning everything they need to know to do their best!
